

incorporated LB 920 which returned the selection of the director of the Natural Resources Commission to be done by the commission itself as opposed now where it is selected by the Governor, reverses what LB 1106 of two years ago, in that section only.

SENATOR WESELY: Okay. Well, I guess at this point I voted for the amendment and I'll probably vote for the advancement of the bill, but that's no small change and I think we all ought to recognize when LB 1106 passed we made that change with the understanding again, as we have in many cases, moving more authority over to the Governor in terms of selection of personnel. But I think, obviously, at this point there is support for that change and for the bill, but please keep in mind what we're doing with this and I think it's important not to recognize it as any small change. It is a major change.

PRESIDENT: Further discussion on the motion to advance? If not, the motion is to advance LB 778. All those in favor say aye. Opposed no. The motion carried. The bill is advanced. Senator Nichol...what's next? LB 753, go ahead.

CLERK: On 753, Mr. President, I don't have any E & R amendments. The first amendment...I have other amendments though, Senator. The first amendment I have, Senator Lamb, I understand you're going to withdraw the one...

SENATOR LAMB: Yes.

CLERK: ...a couple of those that you had printed. Mr. President, I then have a motion to indefinitely postpone the bill which is by Senator Pappas. Senator Lamb would have the option to laying the bill over.

SENATOR LAMB: Take the bill up.

CLERK: Withdraw? Okay. Mr. President, Senator Hefner would move to amend the bill.

SENATOR LAMB: I would take...Senator Hefner put that amendment on at my request, if I could handle that amendment?

PRESIDENT: Go ahead, Senator Lamb.
