

PRESIDENT: Senator Haberman, do you want to take the E & R amendments.

SENATOR HABERMAN: I move to adopt the E & R amendments.

PRESIDENT: You've heard the motion to adopt the Enrollment and Review amendments to 779. All those in favor say aye. Opposed no. The motion carried. The amendments are adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Schmit would move to amend. Senator Schmit's amendments are on page 718 of the Journal.

PRESIDENT: Senator Harris, do you want to handle this amendment?

SENATOR HARRIS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, this is actually an E & R amendment, but it could not be done by that process. It needs to be voted on in the form of an amendment and that's why Senator Schmit proposed the amendment. It's on page 718, 719, and it simply strikes the word "permits" and inserts "license or privilege" in one section. In another it strikes "permits" and inserts "privilege to operate a motor vehicle" and this is to make it in conformity with other law. So I move the adoption of this amendment.

PRESIDENT: Is there discussion on the amendment offered by Senator Schmit and Harris? If not, the motion is to adopt the amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. The motion is to adopt the amendment. Please record your vote. Had 25 there, should have kept it there, (inaudible). Please record your vote on the motion offered by Senator Schmit through Senator Harris to amend 779. The motion is the Harris-Schmit amendment to 779. Please record your vote. Please record your vote on the Schmit-Harris amendment. If you're interested, members, please record your vote on the Schmit amendment to LB 779. Have you all voted? Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of that amendment.

PRESIDENT: The amendment is adopted.
