SENATOR SCHMIT: I move that we bracket the bill, yes.

SENATOR CARSTEN: The question is, shall the bill be bracketed? Senator DeCamp, I didn't get your light turned off. I assume you did not want to speak on this. The question is, shall the bill be bracketed? Do you have anything more you want to offer, Senator Schmit? All those in favor of bracketing LB 603 will vote aye, those opposed will vote no. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 22 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to bracket the bill.

SENATOR CARSTEN: The bill is bracketed. Next is 775, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: LB 775 was a bill introduced by Senator Rogers. (Title read.) The bill was read on January 8 of this year. It was referred to the Agriculture and Environment Committee for public hearing. The bill was advanced to General File. There are committee amendments pending by the Agriculture and Environment Committee, Mr. President. (See page 867 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR CARSTEN: Senator Rod Johnson, are you going to take the committee amendments, please?

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: Mr. President, members, the committee amendments are relatively minor, simply redefining some terms and also changing the date of the implementation of this bill, if it should be passed by the Legislature to July 1, 1987. That date will be again changed by Senator Rogers at a later time to comply with the Department of Agriculture in some findings that he came up with. However, as I said, most of the changes the committee made were simply minor in detail and do not change the scope or the focus of the bill which, depending upon your perspective, will be controversial or not. But at this particular time I'd move the committee amendments.

SENATOR CARSTEN: We have an amendment on the desk, Mr. Clerk.
