LB 775, 783

SENATOR CARSTEN: LB 775 as amended is advanced. Do you have anything to read in, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: No, sir, not at this time.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Next bill is 783. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, 783 was introduced by Senator Beyer. (Title read.) The bill was read on January 8 of this year. It was referred to the Public Works Committee. The bill was advanced to General File, Mr. President. There are committee amendments pending by the Public Works Committee. (See page 869 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR CARSTEN: Senator Schmit, on the committee amendments, please.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President, members of the body...

SENATOR CARSTEN: (Gavel.)

SENATOR SCHMIT: ...the committee amendments strike Section 4 of the bill. Section 4 was a provision in the bill which described a misdemeanor violation and a possible jail sentence for overweight violations. It clarifies the duties of the Department of Motor Vehicles with respect to the enforcement of registration and violations contained in Section 5 of the bill. The committee did not feel that although there was a problem as described by Senator Beyer with out-of-state drivers not returning to settle up for their violation, that we did not think it was justifiable to place one of those individuals in jail, so we struck that provision of the bill. I would urge the members of this body to adopt the committee amendments. Senator Beyer has another amendment which then will correct his problem and I would also urge the adoption of the Beyer amendment.
