SENATOR CARSTEN: Senator Schmit, on the committee amendments, please.

SENATOR SCHMIT: The committee amendments are amendments that were suggested by the introducers of the bill. Both Senator Landis and Senator Smith concur with these amendments that make several minor and clarifying changes in the bill as it was originally introduced. First, the amendment provides that the Advisory Committee shall meet on a quarterly basis. Second, instructor permits shall be valid for a period of three years instead of only for a period of two years as under the current law. Third, the amendment provides that a chief instructor applicant must agree to teach an instructor preparation course at least once per year for two years before any reimbursement can be obtained. And, fourth, a new Section 22 provides for the transfer of records, files, equipment from the Department of Education to the Department of Motor Vehicles and, finally, the amendment provides that the rules and regs which are currently in effect will remain in full force until new rules and regulations are adopted and promulgated by the Department of Motor Vehicles. Mr. President, as I indicated earlier, the introducers concur with these amendments and I move for their adoption.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Is that your opening and closing on the committee amendments? There are no other lights on. We do have some amendments to the committee amendments as are presented to the Clerk. Senator Hoagland. Mr. Clerk, do you want to...?

CLERK: Yes, sir. Senator Hoagland would move to amend the committee amendments. (Hoagland amendment appears on pages 1364-65 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR CARSTEN: Senator Hoagland.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: I have a simple amendment to the committee amendments, ladies and gentlemen, which is being passed out right now. You'll have it in your hand shortly and what it requires, it's simply an informational amendment. It calls upon the Superintendent of the State Patrol and the Director of the Office of Highway Safety to
