SPEAKER NICHOL: You've heard the motion. All those in favor say aye. Opposed nay. We are recessed. Remember, eight o'clock in the morning.

RECESS

PRESIDENT MCGINLEY PRESIDING

PRESIDENT: (Recorder not on.) ...into the Chamber and record your presence so that we may acquire a quorum for this afternoon's session. Record the roll, Mr. Clerk. I mean...can't do that.

CLERK: There is a quorum present, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Quorum present, the Legislature is in session. Do you have any matters for the record, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: No, sir, I do not.

PRESIDENT: Then according to the agenda, we have a Special Order to take up LB 219.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 219 was introduced by Senator Haberman and Senator Remmers. (Read title.) The bill was introduced in January of last year. At that time, Mr. President, it was referred to the Revenue Committee for public hearing. There was a motion filed by Senator Carson Rogers on April 16 of 1985 to raise the bill from committee. That motion prevailed. The bill was placed on General File, Mr. President. That is the status of the bill as it exists today.

PRESIDENT: Senator Haberman. The Chair is going to give you the privilege of explaining the bill. I thought
