

SENATOR HABERMAN: Yes, please.

CLERK: Senator, which one would you like to offer first?

SENATOR HABERMAN: We will start off with putting a sunset.

CLERK: Okay. Mr. President, Senator Haberman would move to amend the bill. (Read first Haberman amendment found on page 1374 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR HABERMAN: Fellow members, Mr. Speaker and members of the body, I am putting a deadline or a sunset on this bill to show that I am not trying to be greedy and that the farmers aren't greedy and the agriculture sector isn't greedy, and I am willing to live with this and let's try it out for 5 years, and if it isn't working, we will come back and change it if necessary or leave it sunset. So I would like to ask you to adopt this amendment to have the sunset clause on LB 219.

PRESIDENT: Senator Remmers, do you wish to speak on the amendments? Senator Rod Johnson, on the Haberman amendments.

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: I would rather speak on the bill.

PRESIDENT: Very well, anyone wish to speak on the Haberman amendment? Any closing, Senator Haberman? Motion is to adopt the amendment offered by Senator Haberman to LB 219.
