SENATOR V. JOHNSON: If you wish to proceed with the roll call, I don't need to wait for Senators DeCamp and...

SENATOR CARSTEN: Senator Smith and DeCamp.

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: I believe Senator DeCamp has gone for the day and just failed to get himself excused, so we could proceed with the roll.
