SENATOR HABERMAN: I don't want to take up any more time, Mr. President, but I will ask for a call of the house and take call in votes.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Call of the house has been requested and we will take in...we will take in call ins. The house is under call. Oh, excuse me.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Can I have a record vote?

SENATOR CARSTEN: The motion is, shall the house go under call? All those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Mr. President.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Now the house is under call. All those senators who are not at their seats, please return. Unauthorized personnel leave the floor. Those senators that can hear me, please return and register your presence. We will accept call in votes.

CLERK: Senator Schmit voting yes. Senator Baack voting yes. Senator Harris voting no. Senator Abboud voting yes. Senator Conway voting yes. Senator Withem voting no. Senator Scofield voting no.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 15 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Record vote has been requested.

CLERK: (Read the record vote. See pages 1388-89 of the Legislative Journal.) 28 ayes, 15 nays, Mr. President.

SENATOR CARSTEN: LB 219 is advanced from General File. Next is 219A. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, 219A was a bill introduced by Senator Haberman. (Read title.)

SENATOR CARSTEN: Senator Haberman. The call is raised. Senator Haberman, on the A bill. Senator, I can't. Senator Vard Johnson has his light on. Senator Johnson, please.
