LB 512, 530, 534

CLERK: (Read LB 512 on Final Reading.)

PRESIDENT: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 512 pass? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: (Read record vote as found on page 1402 of the Legislative Journal.) 47 ayes, 0 nays, 2 excused and not voting, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: A majority having voted in the affirmative, the bill is declared passed. Next is LB 530.

CLERK: (Read LB 530 on Final Reading.)

PRESIDENT: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 530 pass? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Read record vote as found on page 1403 of the Legislative Journal.) 44 ayes, 2 nays, 1 present and not voting, 2 excused and not voting, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: A majority having voted in the affirmative, LB 530 declared passed. The Chair would announce that on behalf of Senator Nelson she has guests under the south balcony this morning, Dr. Stines and Dr. Bunger, both from Grand Island. Welcome, gentlemen, to the State Legislature. Please stand and be recognized. The Chair would explain, to the visitors from the School for the Deaf in Omaha, that this morning we are Final Reading which is the final passage of bills that have been introduced and debated on the floor and are now being voted into law. And 25 votes are required to pass a bill. That will go into effect three months from the time the Legislature adjourns. And 33 votes are required for a bill to have the emergency clause, which takes effect immediately upon the Governor's signature. We have one more bill this morning that has the emergency clause. The Clerk will proceed with the reading...Final Reading of LB 534.
