CLERK: (Read record vote as found on page 1414 of the Legislative Journal.) 49 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the passage of the bill.

PRESIDENT: The vote being unanimous, the Chair declares there is a sufficient majority that the bill passes with the emergency clause attached. Next, before we go to 1114A, (gavel) the Speaker wishes to have it known that the appropriations bills will begin to be taken up on Tuesday next, not on Monday. Appropriations bills on Tuesday. The Clerk will proceed with the reading of LB 1114A with the emergency clause.

CLERK: (Read LB 1114A on Final Reading.)

PRESIDENT: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 1114A pass with the emergency clause attached? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Please record your vote on the final passage of 1114A. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Read record vote as found on pages 1414-15 of the Legislative Journal.) 46 ayes, 0 nays, 2 present and not voting, 1 excused and not voting, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: A sufficient majority having voted in the affirmative, the bill is declared passed with the emergency clause attached. That completes Final Reading for the day. The Clerk has matters for the record.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have explanation of vote by Senator Haberman. Report of registered lobbyists for the week of March 6. I have a motion to be printed from Senator Lundy and others. (See page 1416 of the Journal for motion concerning LR 322.)
