SPEAKER NICHOL: I would rule that it is not germane. Would you like to talk further on it, Senator.

SENATOR HARTNETT: It is your decision.

SPEAKER NICHOL: All right. It may be in the same section. However, I don't believe that it is germane to the subject of the bill. With that, Senator Conway, would you like to close on the advancement of the bill. Excuse me, Senator Pappas's light was on. I guess he took it off.

SENATOR CONWAY: At this point, I would request we advance the bill, please.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay, the question is the advancement of the bill. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Machine vote. You are voting on the advancement of the bill. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 2 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance the bill.

SPEAKER NICHOL: LB 1041 advances. Let's take up the A bill, Senator Conway. Just a moment, Senator Conway.

CLERK: Mr. President, on the A bill, there are no E & R amendments. However, Senator Conway would move to amend the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Conway.

SENATOR CONWAY: Mr. Speaker, members of the body, I offer an amendment to the A bill, 1041A. As we advanced it off of General File, the A bill read for \$950,000 which was the vehicle by which we would be putting the trust fund monies into the General Fund and then have the ability to transfer those back out to the recipient tracks. Since the committee amendments, the committee amendments made a minor change to the percentage takeout from 1 percent for Ak-Sar-Ben and 1/2 percent for the other tracks, and via that change, it allowed the A bill to be reduced down to \$856,000 rather than 950. So it is simply a reduction off the original A bill and I urge the acceptance of this amendment.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The question is the adoption of the Conway amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay.
