

SENATOR CARSTEN: All those in favor of adopting the E & R amendments say aye. Those opposed no. They are adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have an amendment to the bill from Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Senator DeCamp, amendment to LB 105.

SENATOR DECAMP: We have got two amendments, one is my version which is the broader version of expanding the grandparents' rights. The other version is one I think maybe agreed upon now by a certain number of people from Senator Hoagland to Senator Johnson. So I will pull my amendment and let them take a shot at theirs.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Is that what you want?

SENATOR DECAMP: Yes, okay.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Are you going to withdraw it?

SENATOR DECAMP: Yes, let Lowell go with the one they have kind of got agreed upon, well, agreed upon everybody except Ernie.

SENATOR CARSTEN: So ordered.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment I have to the bill is the amendment offered by Senator Johnson, Lowell Johnson, Senator Hoagland. Senator, this is AM2433. Okay, that amendment is on page 1351 of the Journal, Mr. President.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Senator Lowell Johnson, please.

SENATOR L. JOHNSON: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, this particular amendment was recommended, suggested by the bill drafter to put the bill more in conformity with the state's divorce laws. It simply adds the words "by personal service" to Section 3, part 2 of LB 105. After a petition is filed by a grandparent seeking visitation, that petition must be served upon the defendants, this amendment allowing the servicing of the petition be done by personal service. The language following this says, "or in the manner provided in Section 25-517.02" and is the same language used in Nebraska's divorce laws. That section has language which
