SENATOR CARSTEN: Senator Hoagland, will you respond, please.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: Yes. Well, Senator Johnson and Senator Chambers and I have been talking and I think we are in agreement on the "clear and convincing" amendment. We would like to suggest to Senator Chambers a slight change in the other amendment. I think we are very close to an agreement which could bring it to a vote in the next 15 minutes, Senator DeCamp. So I am optimistic we can get that done, yes.

SENATOR DECAMP: Okay. Well, I would encourage us to get this over with and go home.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Thank you. Senator Labeledz, please.

SENATOR LABEDZ: I call the question.

SENATOR CARSTEN: The question has been called. Do I see five hands? One, two, three, four, I do. The question is, shall debate cease? All those in favor of the motion will vote aye, those opposed will vote no. Have you all voted? Senator Labeledz, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR LABEDZ: I believe we are going to have to have everybody in here for a vote on the amendment anyway so I will have a call of the house.

SENATOR CARSTEN: The question is, shall the house go under call? All those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.
