

not, again, our rule. The rules say that a nongermane amendment is one that has a substantially different subject or accomplishes a substantially different purpose and I don't believe that you can separate the love that grandparents profess to have, and I am one and I have got that love, for grandchildren which the proponents have been suggesting is the purpose of this bill. How can you separate that love from the need to provide the basic resources of life? None of us who are grandparents would allow any of our grandchildren to go hungry knowingly. None of us who are grandparents would allow our grandchildren to not have proper clothes or a proper warm home if we could possibly help it. So it seems to me the natural sequence is to say that if you are concerned and you love your grandchildren and you want to visit them, then you ought to also accept the responsibility which most of us as grandparents would be willing to do to provide the basic necessities of life. I would also tell you that if we followed...if this was in one...if this was a bill dealing with child support or dealing with visitation orders that we certainly under the normal procedures that we follow would say that it is germane. Child support, I have a copy of the statutes in front of me, child support is in Chapter 42-364.06 through 364.10, enforcement of visitation orders is in 42-364.15, all in the same area, the same sections of the statutes. Now, I think you would find it very difficult if you had a bill dealing with from 42-364.06 to 42-364.15 to say that amendment was not germane that close in the statutes. So I think that it is...I do this very reluctantly because I very rarely vote to overrule the Chair, but I think the Chair in this case has made a mistake. Finally, I think that there are those people of us who have been opposing this bill who could wind up supporting it with this amendment attached.

SPEAKER NICHOL: I have several lights on but I don't know which ones of you wish to speak to overruling the Chair situation. Senator Labeledz, did you, overruling the Chair? Senator Chambers, on overruling the Chair.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, with all due respect, I think the Speaker is trying to wrap this issue up so he is making a ruling not on the merits of the question before us.
