

she goes to court to see the child. Then suddenly when he or she goes to court to see the child, then maybe, you know, visitation is usually one day every other week in a marital divorce situation or maybe two days every other week, suddenly at that point, for reasons I don't understand, we are going to impose a financial obligation on a grandparent that he never had in the first place. Now, maybe we want to do that. We may want to do that, but, you see, it is a very major change in the whole concept of divorce law, more fundamentally in the whole concept of the rights and obligations of a grandparent to a grandchild. It is establishing a new concept that we never done...we have never had in Nebraska law before. It is really not germane to this bill at all. It is a very different subject matter and in any event I don't think this is the puppy to put that concept on. I think Senator DeCamp is absolutely right, let's save that bill for another day, another hearing when we can thoroughly examine the ramifications. And I would urge you not to support this amendment today. Thank you.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Miller, please.

SENATOR MILLER: Call the question.
