that continues to be there in terms of the Board of Dental Examiners, and work and employment settings situations, that we don't give up on that oversight function, and that that continues, despite some of the changes in the statute that we are talking about here, so we don't have an open door that has no restrictions on it. That was a great concern, and with the floor comments that have made, I'd ask that this amendment be withdrawn with the understanding that the intent is clear that this bill is not as broad as was indicated earlier by Senator Marsh.
