

Senator Rod Johnson has asked for a roll call vote. Would you like for the roll to be called, or do you wish to have us wait for the four, Senator Johnson? Senator Johnson, would you like for the roll to be called notwithstanding the absences of four people? Do you want the roll called? All right, we will commence with the roll call. This is a motion, incidentally, to return LB 899 to Select File for a specific amendment.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 1464 of the Legislative Journal.) 11 ayes, 28 nays on the motion to return, Mr. President.

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: The motion failed. I think we will now move on to our next agenda item which is LB 529. Some person here has an amendment to that bill, and it looks that some person is Senator Hannibal. Am I right or wrong? It's not. Okay.

CLERK: Mr. President, on 529 I have a motion to return the bill from Senators Lamb and Hoagland. (See reference to AM2548 on page 1464 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: We are under call. We are on Final Reading. You have to remain in your seat. What is this motion, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Mr. President, the motion is to return the bill for specific amendment.

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: And who has made the motion?

CLERK: Senators Lamb and Hoagland.

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: Senators Lamb and Hoagland, who will carry that? Senator Hoagland, you are on.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: At the outset, Mr. President, may I inquire didn't we have a rule change at the beginning of the session. The President is on the phone, he's not listening. But I think we had a rule change indicating that when we are discussing amendments on Final Reading the in your seat requirement is waived. But that is neither here nor there. Now that he's off the phone, didn't we have a rule change, Mr. President, you don't have to seat in your seats when we are considering amendments on Final Reading?
