

amendments, before this session is over, to some bills. I have to find those bills at whatever stage of consideration I'm lucky enough to become aware of them. And I will offer those amendments. And I want to see if those who are coming from the Watergate era, offering this amendment, will have the same liberal attitude when others of us want to offer amendments. So I will vote to return this bill. I will vote to add the amendment. I will vote to readvance the bill, and I may vote for its final passage. But by the same token I hope the body keeps in mind what is being done here this morning because we are going to see much more of it in the future. I hope that Senator Hoagland, of all people, will not rise in righteous indignation or whatever it is and tell the body that this is not the way to legislate. Because if he does, Senator Vard Johnson, may my tongue lose her cunning, and may my right arm lose her cunning, and my tongue cleave to the roof of my mouth if I don't stand and point a menacing finger at him and assume the most ominous aspect as I can and say for shame, Senator Hoagland, for shame.

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: Well, Senator Hoagland, you are up to close on this embarrassment.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: I think more than enough has been said about this noncontroversial, innocent amendment, Mr. President. I'd ask its adoption.

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: All right. The motion is to return LB 529 to Select File for a specific amendment. Record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 2 nays on the motion to return the bill, Mr. President.

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: The bill has now been returned to Select File for specific amendment. Senator Hoagland, or Senator Lamb, do you wish to offer that amendment please?

SENATOR HOAGLAND: Yes. Senator Lamb and I would ask the adoption of AM2548.

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: All right. There being no further lights, no speakers, the motion before you is the adoption of the specific amendment as previously described. Record, please.
