

Community Development Block Grant Program Advisory Committee. The Block Grant Advisory Committee establishes some of the guidelines and suggestions that this Legislature has tried to work on recently as well as the appointment of municipal officials from a number of different classes of cities to advise the department. There is a statement of department duties and strategies. There is a special section on the responsibilities of each of the sections I just named. In other words, Travel and Tourism Department's responsibilities, the Small Business Division's responsibilities, the Recruitment Division, the Community Development Division, and the Telecommunications and Information Division's responsibilities, and there is, as I say, a section by section statement of the committee amendments on your desk. I would move for the adoption of the committee amendments.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator DeCamp, please. Senator DeCamp, just a minute, we have an amendment to the committee amendments. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Senator Landis would move to amend his committee amendments, Mr. President, and that amendment is on page 1319 of the Journal.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: Thank you, and if I have that number correct, this was brought to me by the administration. In utilizing some new language on the telecommunications field, there was an inadvertent repealer of some existing language, and that existing language is still necessary. You will recall that last year we passed a bill on telecommunications. I believe Senator Morehead was one of the chief spokespersons if not introducers of that measure, and that is law, but because of the transference of programs here and the movement of them, there was an inadvertent repeal of some language of authorization for that area of telecommunications, and this is a technical amendment that I would move to have adopted at this point, and then we could discuss the more substantive amendment that is proposed apparently by Senator DeCamp.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Does anyone wish to speak to the amendment to the amendment? If not, the question is the adoption of the amendment to the amendment. All those in favor vote
