SENATOR GOODRICH: Now, do you mean to strike the words "the court" on line 7?

SENATOR PIRSCH: Yes, because we repeat it then...

SENATOR GOODRICH: Okay.

SENATOR PIRSCH: ...in determining whether to revoke probation or parole the court or Board of Parole and you do have a good point on the or. We do have the ors in that.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Okay, I see, on line 8 you just continue on, you've got a period there, but you should have struck the period.

SENATOR PIRSCH: Right, with the same Judiciary Committee language.

SENATOR GOODRICH: The Board of Parole shall consider the defendants, okay. If you get the "or" instead of "and" and you strike the period you're okay I guess. Okay, thank you.
