SENATOR SCOFIELD: You may, Senator Pirsch.

SENATOR PIRSCH: Thank you.

SENATOR SCOFIELD: Motion has been made for the house to go under call. All those in favor vote aye, those opposed nay. Record, please.

CLERK: 16 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Madam President.

SENATOR SCOFIELD: The house is under call. If you're within hearing of my voice, please return to the Chamber and register your presence.

SENATOR PIRSCH: I'll take call ins.

SENATOR SCOFIELD: Senator Pirsch will take call in votes.

CLERK: Senator Beyer voting yes. Senator Rogers voting yes. Senator Hartnett voting yes.

SENATOR SCOFIELD: Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 2 nays, Madam President, to cease debate.

SENATOR SCOFIELD: Debate has ceased. Senator Pirsch.

SENATOR PIRSCH: Thank you, Madam President. If you would please look at your handout that was passed out, it does show the condition of restitution in the 50 states in the United States. Now, all 50 states, including Nebraska, have enacted legislation which authorized their courts to order the offender to make restitution to the victim of the crime.
