SENATOR CARSTEN: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Hoagland, now would you care to close, please?

SENATOR CARSTEN: The question is, shall LB 70 be bracketed until...what's the date, the 25th? April 3. All those in favor of that motion to bracket will vote aye, those opposed will vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 31 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to bracket the bill.

SENATOR CARSTEN: The motion carries and LB 70 is bracketed. We'll relax for just a second, but I guess we're ready to go. Boy, it didn't take long to put the baling wire on this time. Thank you, Mr. Clerk. What's next, Mr. Clerk? Do you have something to read in?

CLERK: No, sir, not at this time.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Okay.
