SENATOR CARSTEN: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. And, again, reminding you upon adjournment Room 1520 to spend a little time with the Governor. Senator Chambers, on your amendment to the committee amendments.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I will withdraw it.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Any objection? If not, so ordered. What is next, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Mr. President, we are back to the committee amendments then at this point.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Senator Hoagland, please.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: We had previously explained yesterday afternoon, Senator Pirsch and I, the committee amendments. You will recall that Senator Pirsch's amendment to expand the coverage of the bill to include parole situation was adopted. The committee amendments now, as amended, constitute principally American Bar Association model language on restitution applicable to a probation situation and a parole situation. It is the best language on the subject that we have been able to find in the Judiciary Committee. I would ask the adoption of the committee amendments.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Senator DeCamp, please, on the amendment.

SENATOR DECAMP: Well, maybe I am making an unnecessary interference but I would like to ask Senator Pirsch a question.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Senator Pirsch. Senator Pirsch, will you yield to a question from Senator DeCamp, please.

SENATOR PIRSCH: Yes, Senator DeCamp.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DECAMP: Okay, I read your amendment yesterday. It is my understanding the amendment was adopted. Right?
