

March 18, 1986 LB 1124A, 1124

CLERK: 26 ayes, 5 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance the bill.

SENATOR CARSTEN: LB 1124 is advanced as amended. We move now to 1124A. This will be the last bill for this afternoon, then we will adjourn after that.

CLERK: M. President, LB 1124A was a bill introduced by Senators Wesely and Hefner. (Read.)

SENATOR CARSTEN: Senator Wesely on 1124A.

SENATOR WESELY: Yes. When we create this credit it will take some revamping of the computer system at revenue. So this would fund that cost. I move its advancement.

SENATOR CARSTEN: You have an amendment to the bill, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Haberman would move to amend the bill. (Haberman amendment is found on page 1510 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR CARSTEN: Senator Haberman on the amendment. Senator Haberman, if I may before you take your amendment, we do have some guests in the north balcony of Senator Higgins this afternoon, 24 ladies from the National Association of Bank Women. We welcome you to the Unicameral Legislature and hope you enjoy your stay. Will you rise so that we may recognize you, please. Thank you, Senator Haberman. Now on your amendment to 1124A.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Mr. President, members of the body, Senator Wesely briefly exchanged that he needed an A bill of \$110,000 and \$87,000 because it will take some revamping in the peer system in the Revenue Department. I have no problem with that. But what I am striking from the bill is line 11, 12, 13, and 14; 8, 9, and 10 say there shall be no expenditures for permanent and temporary salaries for the period January 1, 1986 to January 30, 1987. I'm leaving that. What I'm striking is total expenditures for permanent and temporary salaries and per diems from funds appropriated in this section shall not exceed \$12,500 for the period of July 1, 1987 to June 30, 1988. I don't think we need that because if they need the extra \$12,500 they can come back and ask for it. I can't see where it ties into the whole
