SPEAKER NICHOL: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 762 pass? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: (Record vote read. See pages 1520-21 of the Legislative Journal.) 43 ayes, 0 nays, 3 excused and not voting, 3 present and not voting, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: LB 762 passes. Now, Senator Vickers has asked that we skip 795 for a few moments pending the arrival of an amendment, and 795A. We will skip to 796.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have a motion on LB 796. Senator Vard Johnson would move to return the bill to Select File...I am sorry, he moves to bracket the bill until April 1, 1986.
