SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President, why don't we just have a roll call vote. Yes, let's have a roll call vote.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay, a roll call vote on the return of the bill. Request for reverse order.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken in reverse order. See page 1537 of the Legislative Journal.) 22 ayes, 21 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to return the bill.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The motion fails. Do you have anything else on the bill?

CLERK: Yes, sir, I do. Mr. President, the next motion I have is by...Senator Abboud, you had a motion, Senator. I understand you want to substitute, withdraw this one and substitute.(The Abboud amendment appears on pages 1537-38 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER NICHOL: Any objections? Senator Abboud.

SENATOR ABOUD: Mr. President and colleagues, this is an amendment that deals with juvenile court judges. As you recall, LB 516 has been a vehicle for a number of different bills and LB 516 had an amendment that was attached on Select File that allowed county court judges to be used in cases with juvenile court judge hearings. I believe you have on your desks the amendment that is being offered. It is an amendment that is being offered by Senator Withem and myself, and what the amendment provides for that if they do use a county court judge in juvenile court cases that they won't...I should say they won't be using the county court judge in juvenile court cases if its in the County of Douglas or I believe this just affects Douglas County, a county now having more than 300,000 persons so that would be Douglas County. If we do get a third juvenile court judge, then there will be no need to use county court judges in the juvenile court system, but in addition to that, the second part of the amendment provides that as of after July 1, 1990, no judge of the county court shall be served in the separate juvenile court judge system. So it essentially sunsets the amendment that was adopted on Select File. Now, part of the reason why this amendment is being offered at this particular time is I have a firm belief, as do a number
