

third juvenile court judge is appointed that this power will terminate, or lacking our ability to get that third juvenile judge assigned, that we say by July 1 of 1990, that we no longer have this temporary solution and that we kind of hold our feet to the fire in here to have us come up with a more permanent solution. I think what Senator Abboud and I are doing on this amendment is offering a compromise sort of proposal that will solve the temporary staffing problems in Douglas County but will not provide a permanent type of solution to the problem, that we, the Legislature, between now and 1990 have to either hire an additional, authorize an additional juvenile court judge for Douglas County or come up with some other solution to the problem. So I would appreciate your adoption of the amendment.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Hoagland, please.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: Let me state briefly, colleagues, that Senator Withem and Senator Abboud have presented what Senator Vard Johnson and I feel is a reasonable compromise to the concerns that we have about the staffing of juvenile court. And we would encourage the adoption of this amendment.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay. The question is the adoption of the Abboud-Withem amendment, it is actually the return of the bill for an amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. You are voting on the return of the bill. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to return the bill.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The bill is returned. May I introduce some guests that are coming in at this time. They are guests of Senator Rogers. They are 45 eighth grade students from Centura Public School, accompanied by their sponsors. They are in the north balcony. Would you please welcome them to the Legislature. Thank you for visiting us today. The bill is returned. The question now is to adopt the amendment. All right, the question is the adoption of the amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.
