I want to tell you again I hope this amendment does what it is purported to do. But I can't tell you that it will. And I challenge anyone else here to prove to me this morning that it will. I would vote for the amendment. It makes a bad situation better, I hope. But I would want to remind you once again that I doubt very seriously that this amendment, as written, would be offered to you this morning had I not offered my amendment. Thank you very much.
