

there, a service that is needed, that is now located in basements working with obsolete material, some of it. Some of it is not obsolete. Some of it is very up-to-date, that can be moved into the new building. And this is good legislation.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Hall, would you like to move the advancement of the bill.

SENATOR HALL: Mr. President, I'd move that LB 1038 be advanced to E & R for Engrossment.

SPEAKER NICHOL: All those in favor say aye. Opposed nay. It is advanced. Now we get to go to appropriation bills already. Mr. Clerk, where were we?

CLERK: Mr. President, let's see, 1250, of course, is the bill relating to salaries of state employees. There was an amendment from the committee that was adopted yesterday. The next amendment I have, Mr. President, is an amendment from Senator Vickers to the bill. (Vickers amendment appears on page 1542 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Vickers, please. You have an amendment, Senator Vickers.

SENATOR VICKERS: Mr. President, members, the amendment that I have to LB 1250 is one that I offer in good faith because it seems to me that we do have a situation that on the state level we are trying to recognize the fact that we've got some difficulties. We've got some difficulties, economically, and we are liable to be faced with a severe situation if, in fact, the Commission of Industrial Relations comes in with a recommendation, as far as salaries are concerned, that could cause us some real economical distress. But the fact of the matter is that is not applicable only to those of us at the state level. It is also applicable to an awfully lot of political subdivisions out there. It is applicable to a lot of school districts, a lot of tech schools, a lot of cities, counties, and others, and they have told us that in the past. Now, as I read this bill on this particular section that I offer the amendment to, and it is on Section 2, subsection (2), on page 3, lines 3 through 8, the language says that the scales of wages or salaries for employees of the Board of Regents or the University of Nebraska and the Board of Trustees of the
