

whole economic question of state intervention, state involvement, state ordering this or that on a particular business. And you have to answer the question is it necessary, is it reasonable, is the job able to be done within the industry or business as opposed to state intervention? I guess you've had all the information from so many sources, I think you can reasonably conclude that state intervention is not necessary, in this case, and that the matter can be handled by negotiations, if necessary, between labor unions and management on the issue of employment which is really, I think, the hidden issue that we don't talk about, but I think it is really the essence of this issue.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay. The house is under call. Will you please record your presence. Those not in the Chamber, please return to the Chamber and record your presence. Unauthorized personnel, please leave the floor. Looking for Senator Lundy and Senator Higgins. Just looking for Senator Higgins. Senator Hannibal, Senator Higgins is the only one gone, do you want to go without her?

SENATOR HANNIBAL: Let's go ahead and roll it.

SPEAKER NICHOL: All right, regular roll call. Please hold it down so the Clerk can hear your response. And please take your seat so we can have the roll call. Thank you. Mr. Clerk.
