SENATOR REMMERS: Senator Warner. Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. Chairman, Mr. President, members, just a couple of other thoughts that had occurred to me. One is the paradox that I find interesting. I know it is true, and I've been told, and I do not question it that there is difficulty in getting donations from those large groups that make donations unless there are some state funds in it. The paradox is that is the same corporations who I get telephone calls and correspondence, by golly you can't increase the income tax and you've got to cut government because there are too many things being offered. Then they turn around and say well, by golly, you can't cut government because we won't volunteer contributions unless you spend some money. And I just make it as an observation. It is no different than a whole lot of other issues we deal with from time to time. Again, mention has been made of one of the things that is always frustrating to deal with, and that there is an identifiable need and in recent years the identifiable need has been for the plight of some segments, or all segments perhaps of agriculture. I suppose there were a half a dozen agencies, if not more, in the last two years who have come in with programs carefully thought out, well designed, but with obvious overlap to assist those areas in agriculture with the problems. You constantly run through your mind, yes, the programs are different but, no, there's got to be a duplication in it, and once started the odds of them expanding are very good. So all I would like to suggest I give careful thought. I well appreciate, I don't even argue with those who point out the values, but that really isn't the issue you are facing. The real issue you are facing is how many more we will reinstate. I would be hard pressed to pick out just this commission to be reinstated and to say no, the other ones didn't serve a purpose, because they have a same purpose, same importance, to the groups that were interested in them. For those reasons, I would not support reinstating the money, even though I understand and appreciate the benefits that they do.
