

conducted. On that the issue turned, one, on the fact that the patrol is divided by area; and under area there would be more direct supervision than one person could provide from the state level. That is not to say that it was not being well done. But that was one factor. Another factor that was discussed and in which they felt there was merit was the probability of rotation. As you well know, the individuals who serve in the Liquor Commission, historically at least, have served the same area, and again not because anything has happened, at least not that I'm aware of, but as a matter of policy it made sense that people were transferred periodically from area to area in order to avoid the good old boy syndrome of state official and with those that they were supervising becoming a problem, not that it is now. But it was those kind of considerations that it seemed desirable. But still blocking it...

SENATOR REMMERS: One minute.

SENATOR WARNER: ...was the fact that 12 people would be losing their jobs, or up to 12. So we felt that it was appropriate to do as we have done so many other times, that the people move with the positions, they do not become patrolmen. But as attrition occurs, through retirement or individuals leaving for other job opportunities, that those replacements would be patrolmen, and over a course of time then the broader policy could be accomplished. That was the basis for the decision. I think the committee almost...I think all of us pretty much concurred in the final recommendation which not only moves the positions but the people to under the patrol...

SENATOR REMMERS: Time.

SENATOR DECAMP: ...for the reasons that I earlier described.
