CLERK: Mr. President, if I might add that your Committee on Enrollment and Review reports 1250 to Select File with E & R amendments and 1250A to Select File with E & R amendments, those signed by Senator Hall. (See pages 1586-87 of the Legislative Journal.)

Mr. President, the next order of business is LB 1126. It was a bill introduced by Senators Lamb, Remmers, Richard Peterson, Barrett, Eret, Carsten, Hefner and Sieck. (Title read.) The bill was introduced on January 21 of this year. It was referred to the Education Committee, Mr. President. The bill was advanced to General File. There are Education Committee amendments pending.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Vickers, please.

SENATOR VICKERS: Mr. President, members, the Education Committee amendment, all it does is to put in place, or insert a section for the operative date. It was felt that we'd ought to give the schools a little bit of time to adjust to the change if we were going to make the policy change that LB 1126 called for. So the committee amendment simply inserts a section. The operative date would be June 1st, 1987.

SPEAKER NICHOL: I have understand we have an amendment to the committee amendments. Senator Lamb.

SENATOR LAMB: Mr. President, if it would be in order, I would like to have a few minutes to discuss the bill and introduce the bill before we get into the amendments, if that's permissible.
