

so that only cost is covered and consequently, if the other district that you're sending them to will not accept them, you've built in a roadblock for your own district's students and consequently you're not fair with those people themselves, let alone the people that are going to receive those students in that district and have increased facility maintenance, increased facility cost itself, everything increased cost because of the students that they accepted. Now I know they don't have to accept them, but if they don't, then you're really being unfair with the people that are in the sending district. So consequently the fairness doesn't even get into the subject of this bill. I would strongly oppose John's amendment. Thank you.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Scofield, on the DeCamp amendment.

SENATOR SCOFIELD: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. If Senator DeCamp is around, I'd like to ask him a question, if I could, please.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Pardon me, I couldn't hear you, Senator Scofield.

SENATOR SCOFIELD: If Senator DeCamp would respond, I'd just like to ask him a question. Senator DeCamp, on your proposal, and I appreciate the points that Vard Johnson makes, but I'm concerned that they may or may not be relevant depending on how you're going to define actual cost and how we're going to calculate that, and if you could expand on that for me a bit and clarify it, I'd appreciate it.

SENATOR DECAMP: The answer to that is, they may classify or clarify or establish actual cost any way you want. I make no judgments as to how that should be established. If Senator Goodrich says, it should include cost of the building, cost of this, cost of that, that's all fine. All I am saying is very simply this, and by the way, I never mentioned fairness, not one time, because fairness is not necessarily involved. I'll explain that later. My point is simply this, Senator Scofield. Whatever you determine the cost to be through whatever formula, then it makes no logical or other sense to say cost plus 50 percent or cost plus 1 percent. The issue is two concepts, two systems. One is a cost system, the other is a property tax system. That's what the issue is. I am saying, if you are going to
