

all voted? Have you all voted? Senator Vickers.

SENATOR VICKERS: Well, Mr. President, rather than to take up anymore time, I'm just going to ask for a call of the house and a roll call vote.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Call of the house has been requested. All those in favor of going under call will vote aye, those opposed will vote no. Senator Hannibal, will you poke your button. please. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 40 ayes, 0 nays to go under call.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Will you, in your seats, please register your presence. All those outside the Chamber, please return and push your green button, please. We are under call. Senators Harris, Miller, Schmit, Senator Schmit is here, Senator Withem. Senator Withem. Okay, all that are not excused are accounted for. We will proceed. Did you want a roll call vote? We will proceed with the roll call vote. Mr. Clerk, on the Vickers motion.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 1618 of the Legislative Journal.) 23 ayes, 21 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the amendment.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Motion fails. Do you have another motion on the desk, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Mr. President,...

SENATOR CARSTEN: Call is raised.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senators Vickers and Rod Johnson would move to amend the bill. (Vickers-R. Johnson amendment is printed on page 1618 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR CARSTEN: Senator Vickers, on your new motion.

SENATOR VICKERS: Mr. President and members, this is another amendment to raise the consciousness of this body as to the results of our actions. You will have handed out to you a copy of the amendment. But what it does is it adds \$250,000 to the budget, to the Division of Job Training in the Department of Labor, to maintain, at a reduced level, I need to emphasize that, at a reduced level, those programs that
