

get money from corporations knowing that these corporations doors are not open to Mexicans and are not open to Indians. But you say go to the corporations knowing that only white people can do it. Raise so much money, knowing only the white women can do it. And then when those, who you knew had nothing, come back with nothing, you say I give you nothing because you have nothing. Where much is needed is where we ought to show the most concern, but we don't. We have people in here who go to church and those who teach Sunday school, and they will talk all about the compassion of Christ, how those who have are merely stewards over what they have, how they are supposed to assist those who are scorned, who are rejected, they are to feed the hungry, clothe the naked, minister to the ill, and then have somebody come up here every morning and pray. Then when time comes for us to use our vote in a way to show that we are going to accord people, as much as lies within our ability, a modicum of dignity we vote no. What I may do, which I haven't done since I've been in this Legislature, is start using my vote in the way votes are used here, supporting programs and fighting programs based on the way the game is played here. If I'm in a game and we're playing cards and there are no rules, and you can put cards up your sleeve,...

SENATOR CARSTEN: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...down your shoes, or wherever, and the only rule is that there are no rules, if I try to play by traditional rules I'm not gambling, I'm being a fool, and I'm not cheating if I do what the rest of them do because that is the way the game is played. Finally you all have brought it home to me. There are issues I've carried here that have nothing to do with the people in my district, because I was trying to do what I thought was right for somebody elected to serve. I've gone over this state to talk to these white farmers who have problems and feel they can't come to you. A lot of that I'm dropping those problems. They are not my people. I don't want them coming to my office. I don't want them writing me letters. I don't want...

SENATOR CARSTEN: Time.
