SENATOR WESELY: I will start off and Senator Goll can take the rest of my time. I won't take very long.

SPEAKER NICHOL: All right.

SENATOR WESELY: A minute ago I sent a letter to Senator Nichol that I passed around on the floor. You should all have it on your desk. If you don't, I have got extra copies here that you are welcome to have. They go through the different bills, exactly what we are doing to them so you know what we have been working on. On this particular bill, the athletic trainers came in and wanted licensure. They found through the 407 process there were problem areas that athletic trainers had identified that we need to deal with. The committee came out with a bill, though, that was certification, not licensure, and a very broad application of that, and sitting down with the Health Department and athletic trainers, the focus of the bill was too broad and not getting in on the problem area. The problem area is that there is a number of types of activities that are dangerous if in the hands of somebody that is untrained. These include electrical stimulation, and what we mean by
