

SENATOR HABERMAN: Senator Goll.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Goll, would you respond please?

SENATOR HABERMAN: Page 1, Section 2 states who is authorized, as I read it, to be licensed as an athletic trainer. So it is lines 1 through 8 on page 2, those people would be authorized to be licensed athletic trainers, is this correct?

SENATOR GOLL: It is a definition, Senator Haberman. It says, as you can read, "No person shall be authorized to perform the physical modalities set out in subsection (2)...unless he or she first obtains a license as an athletic trainer or unless such person is licensed..." as those other occupations shown there.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Thank you. Now I have a question. Under the application of electrical stimulation, ultrasound, diathermies, infrared lights, are osteopaths and chiropractors at the present time authorized to use those methods of treatments in their offices?

SENATOR GOLL: I couldn't tell you, Senator Haberman. You would have to ask Senator Chronister that question.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Well, it is your bill, Senator Goll.

SENATOR GOLL: Well, I am not dealing with the chiropractor, I am dealing with athletic trainers.

SENATOR HABERMAN: But it says in here osteopaths and chiropractors can use these things, and I want to know, can they legally use them now?

SENATOR GOLL: I would presume that they can. I read it like you do, Senator Haberman.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Okay, you don't know for sure whether they can...all right, you are saying that whether they are licensed now to use them or whether they are not licensed to use them, underneath this bill, they can use them, that is what you are saying. So who wants to stand up and tell me, Senator Chronister, will you answer a question?
