

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Chambers has asked for a roll call vote. Senator Chambers asked for a roll call vote. Is that correct? All right. Senator Hoagland.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: Can I have a point of order, Mr. Speaker?

SPEAKER NICHOL: Yes.
