SENATOR MARSH: Senator Warner. Senator Haberman.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Madam President and members of the body, a question of Senator Warner, please. Senator Warner, I missed out on Senator Schmit's dissertation but I notice that they are transferring or they are taking 25 cents...did he ask this question, 25 cents from the Nebraska Certificate of Title and giving it to the Attorney General's Office which will amount to 110,000. Did he raise that question?

SENATOR WARNER: Originally, Senator, the original bill had 50 cents going to the Attorney General. That is the current law. It is being reduced by the bill and further reduced by the amendment to 20 cents to the Attorney General. The Attorney General's Office in part currently are contracting with the State Patrol to do the same title inspection or title reviews that...

SENATOR HABERMAN: To check the titles on vehicles and so on and so forth. Title odometer vehicles. Okay, in other words, what you are doing is you are reducing, in essence, the funds that the Attorney General's Office will get.

SENATOR WARNER: That is correct.

SENATOR HABERMAN: And then the difference in those funds...

SENATOR WARNER: Appropriate the money...

SENATOR HABERMAN: ...are going to go to the State Patrol?

SENATOR WARNER: Yes, who are now currently doing all the inspection of titles anyway.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Thank you.

SENATOR MARSH: We are now ready and will vote on the advancement of committee amendments for LB 851. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? The Clerk will record. Senator Goll is requesting that the house go under call.

SENATOR GOLL: I will, Madam Chairperson, unless we can get two more votes.
