LB 1001A, 1089

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Warner, can you answer that easily?

SENATOR WARNER: Yes. The amount of General Fund that would be reflected is \$59,908 of General Fund, \$24,690 of Cash Funds. I'm trying to recall the current appropria...well, the previous appropriation for this activity was all General Fund and at that time it was in the vicinity of \$80,000.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay, the question is the advancement of the A bill. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: LB 1001A advances. LB 1089. We are not going to take that today, is that right? Okay, there is a note here. All right, 1089.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 1089 was introduced by the Appropriations Committee and signed by its members. (Read title.) Read on January 7, referred to the Government Committee, advanced to General File. There are Government Committee amendments pending, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Landis, please.

SENATOR LANDIS: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, these are the committee amendments. The committee amendments strike the references in the bill to the Commission on the Status of Women and what happened in front of the Government Committee was this. We held a hearing on 1089. We took public testimony. There was a great deal of public testimony. It had to do with the activities and accomplishments of that commission and the desire of the people in that room to have a commission continue. There was no public testimony on either of the other two commissions. The committee struck the provision with respect to the Commission on the Status of Women and reported out the bill with the other two commissions still in it. That's the committee amendment and I would move for its adoption.
