SPEAKER NICHOL: The question is the adoption of the committee amendments. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. We're voting on the adoption of the committee amendments. Senator Landis, please.

SENATOR LANDIS: I have no wish to ask for a roll call vote. If the Clerk wishes to record, that would be satisfactory with me.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Have you all voted that care to? Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 10 ayes, 17 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of committee amendments.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The committee amendments are not adopted. May I please introduce some guests of Senator Hoagland in the north balcony. We have 35 eighth grade students from St. Margaret Mary of Omaha and their teacher. Would you folks please stand and be recognized. Thank you for visiting us today. Do you have anything else on the bill, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Hall would move to indefinitely postpone the bill.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Hall.

SENATOR HALL: Mr. President and members, motion to kill the bill. I think enough has been said. The debate has probably been made on the committee amendments. I would urge the body at this time to indefinitely postpone the bill. Thank you.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Warner, do you want to take that up today? All right, we'll take it up today. Senator Chambers, on the kill motion, please. Then Senator Warner.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, as Senator Hall pointed out, the arguments have basically been made, but there is one other point that I think ought to be touched on. In order that when we get to the budget bill again we can discuss this issue and make the
