

SENATOR SMITH: Senator DeCamp, am I correct? Senator Lamb had a concern about the 1991 date of termination or whatever you want to call it, sunseting of this provision. It's because the bill itself only deals with that period of time, doesn't it?

SENATOR DECAMP: Absolutely. We're dealing in a five year range on the deaveraging on trying to get rates to a level where they pay the actual cost. You can't envision what is going to occur in the next 50 years, but you can probably in the next five and that is the framework within which we're trying to deal. The bill also has legislative oversight written into it for the first time forcing the Legislature to be actively involved on a year to year basis. So, this is not the last you're going to deal with the issue. It is going to be an ongoing thing just like it is in all areas of deregulation and this is the first stage.

PRESIDENT: Very well, the motion is the adoption of the Smith amendment to the DeCamp amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 29 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator Smith's amendment to Senator DeCamp's amendment.

PRESIDENT: The amendment to the amendment has been adopted. Now we next go to another amendment.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator DeCamp would move to amend the DeCamp amendment. Senator, I've got AM2707.

SENATOR DECAMP: Well, I'd like to do 2707, 2706. Senator Johnson wants to do 2705 and 2704 at the same time and it's fine by me. Just take them all at once.

CLERK: Tell me again what you want, Senator.

SENATOR DECAMP: Just take 2707, 06, 05 and 04 as one, at the same time.

PRESIDENT: Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: I would object to taking all those amendments at once. I think that it's only fair that we take them one by one because each of those amendments points
