

PRESIDENT: Jacklyn Smith.

SENATOR SMITH: Thank you, Mr. Chairman. I have a motion up there that would ask that we divide the question. I would like to deal with it as a split issue if we could. I don't know what procedure we need to go through here. I am new at this. But I would like to deal with this first part of it striking...where he strikes "twenty" and inserts the "ten" separately from the last one.

PRESIDENT: We will think of that as one point. You are asking to divide the two points.

SENATOR SMITH: Yes.

PRESIDENT: And the Chair will agree, the question is divisible. So on page 2, line 8, strike "twenty" and insert "ten" will be considered now.

SENATOR SMITH: Thank you.

PRESIDENT: And the line 6 strike beginning with the word "This" and through "1991" in line 7 will be considered next.

SENATOR SMITH: All right, thank you. And I would like to speak to that, the second part of the division.

PRESIDENT: Do you have any more on the first part now?

SENATOR SMITH: I don't have anything other than the fact that I am not opposed to what he is suggesting in the first part of this motion, of this amendment, excuse me. But I would like to address the second part of it.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Senator Marsh, do you wish to speak on the first part of the divided question?

SENATOR MARSH: Mr. President, I would call the question, and you have the power to divide it, so then we are having one part of it before us.

PRESIDENT: Yes. I was asking if there are any other...I think in fairness I must ask if somebody wants to speak on the first part of this divided question. Yes. Let me go down the list here because the Chair has been accused of
