PRESIDENT: Anything further, Senator Lundy.

SENATOR LUNDY: Mr. President, members, I, too, oppose this amendment. I just don't see the necessity for it at all, and even though the person that is taking this exam, it seems to me like that it is going to add cost to the Secretary of State's Office. Somebody has to prepare for that exam, and you are just bound and determined to get into additional cost when you do this. There is no reason for it at all. I oppose the amendment.

PRESIDENT: Senator Haberman. If there are no others, I will ask Senator Haberman to close.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Senator Hefner has the gall to stand and said they will be taking exams every day. That is not true. For crying out loud, be reasonable. Now the Secretary of State endorses this, says we need it. The County Officials would like to have it. They say it is a good amendment, and you say that the Revenue Department says they are going to be giving exams every day. Well, you can't believe that. Now it says right here in the amendment, Senator Lundy and Senator Hefner, the amount of such fee shall be determined annually by the Tax Commissioner and shall be sufficient to cover the cost of the examination. Now what will the cost be? People drive to Lincoln, they are given the exam, written exam. They sit there and take the exam and then they leave. Now what cost could that be to the Department of Revenue? All they need is to give the exam to the person. They sit at the table, take the exam, hand it in and leave, and they are not going to do it every day. Plus, if you leave it the way it is, people are excluded from running for the office. They are excluded from running for the office because the exam is only given twice and they cannot legally become a candidate. Now if you believe in that, well, then vote against the amendment. But if you believe that those people should have the right to run for the office, you have to give the exam more than twice a year. So, first of all, your arguments aren't holding water. It isn't going to hurt that much, and I ask you to support the amendment.

PRESIDENT: The argument is closed on the Haberman amendment and all those in favor of adopting the Haberman amendment vote aye, opposed vote nay. The motion is the adoption of the Haberman amendment to LB 1105. Please record your vote. Have you all
