

PRESIDENT MCGINLEY PRESIDING

PRESIDENT: Quorum present, the Legislature is in session. Any matters for the record, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Mr. President, your Committee on Business and Labor reports 1256 to General File, 1255 to General File with amendments, and 1257 indefinitely postponed, those all signed by Senator Barrett. Senator DeCamp has amendments to LB 90 to be printed, Mr. President. I think that is all that I have. (See pages 1727-29 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT: We proceed then to take up Final Reading again, on LB 1038. Members of the Legislature, if you would please take your seats so that we may begin Final Reading. Everyone in your seats for Final Reading. All right, we'll proceed with Final Reading. Senator Pappas, will you take your seat, on 1038.

CLERK: Mr. President, the first item on 1038 is a motion to suspend Rule 8, Section 5 so as to allow for the Final Reading of the bill. That motion is offered by Senator Lowell Johnson.

PRESIDENT: Senator Johnson.

SENATOR L. JOHNSON: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, it is necessary that we take this action in order that we may discuss LB 1038, since LB 1038 is included in the Appropriations Committee package, so-called bills. Reference to the phrase, the appropriations bills, in the rules basically relates to the mainline appropriation bill. I should mention that there is no A bill required on LB 1038 as the bill itself appropriates the funds involved. I move for the adoption of this motion.

PRESIDENT: The motion has been made to suspend the rules in order to take up the reading of LB 1038. Thirty votes are required. Any discussion? All those in favor of the motion to suspend the rules vote aye, opposed vote nay. We're voting to suspend the rules in order to take up 1038, which needs this treatment because of its budgetary nature. The motion is to suspend the rules in order to take up LB 1038 on Final Reading. Please record your vote. Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 32 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, to suspend the rules in order to allow for the reading of the bill.
