SENATOR DEKAMP: He said we have no objection.

SENATOR WARNER: Well that clarifies it a great deal. Thank you. Okay.

PRESIDENT: Well, Senator Landis, are you withdrawing your motion?

SENATOR LANDIS: That explanation having been given, I will withdraw the motion proceeding to a vote.

PRESIDENT: Clerk will read...Senator Nichol. The Chair recognizes Senator Nichol.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, this, too, rings a bell.

PRESIDENT: Are you making a motion on your own?

SPEAKER NICHOL: Yes.

PRESIDENT: That is?

SPEAKER NICHOL: Motion to return to file for specific amendment, to strike the enacting clause.

PRESIDENT: Very well.

SPEAKER NICHOL: About 10 years ago we did the same thing when we had a little more look at it than this, and we did call it the NDIGC. And many of us who supported the bill lived to regret it. The question that has been asked, will this have the name of Nebraska in it or not, hasn't been answered, nor will it have the word guaranty in it. It is a surprising thing, but I have not had a clamoring from my district for a bill of this nature. And I don't think we should do it. I don't think we should pass this bill. Who wants it? Do any of you feel a burning desire for this bill? Has your bank contacted you saying we need this bill? Mine have not done so. I don't know if my banks even know about this bill. If they do, they haven't said anything one way or the other. I'd leave my motion up there, Mr. President.
