SPEAKER NICHOL: Did you remember this bill as being one of those?

SENATOR HEFNER: No, I didn't.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Gee, I'm sorry.

SENATOR HEFNER: Is it? Mr. President, and members of the body, I don't think that we should be doing this. I think the bill was introduced for a specific purpose and we should leave it that way. Now we want to completely gut it and add portions of another bill and I don't know what all is going to go into this bill. In regards to 325 the bill that is coming up next, I too have a motion to strip the senators' retirement because I don't feel that 325 is the place to put this. Let's be up front about this. If we want a senators' retirement, let's introduce a resolution, hold a public hearing and take it to the vote of the people. But I don't think we ought to be doing this with 1129 either. I would urge you to vote against this proposition.
