

CLERK: 16 ayes, 0 nays to go under call.

PRESIDENT: The motion carried. The house is under call. All members in your seats, please look up to the front board and see that your green presence light is on. We are now asking for your presence. Senator Warner, please. Senator Lamb, Senator Harris, Senator Scofield, Senator Smith, Senator Morehead, Senator Conway, Senator Baack.

CLERK: I have several excused here, Governor.

PRESIDENT: I assume, Senator, we may accept call ins on votes.

SENATOR CHRONISTER: Right.

PRESIDENT: Members may call your vote in to the Clerk aye or nay on the Chronister amendment to LB 190. In the meanwhile, will all members outside of the Legislative Chamber return to the Chamber and record your presence. The house is under call. You may call your vote in to the Clerk. Senator Chambers, Senator Conway, would you record your presence, please. Senator Goodrich, Senator Lamb, Senator Scofield. Senator Lamb, Senator Scofield and Senator Chambers. Pardon me?

SENATOR CHRONISTER: In the interest of time, why don't you have the vote.

PRESIDENT: Do you want a roll...are you asking for a roll call?

SENATOR CHRONISTER: Yes.

PRESIDENT: Yes, okay. Do you want to proceed now without the...all right. The Clerk will call the roll on the Chronister amendment aye or nay.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See pages 1773-74 of the Legislative Journal.) 25 ayes, 16 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT: The motion carried, the amendment is adopted. The call of the house is raised. Do you have other amendments?

CLERK: Mr. President, I have a motion to indefinitely postpone the bill by Senator Warner. That would lay it over unless the introducer agrees to take it up at this time.
